hoax:	a trick, especially a made-up story made to look like it's true	
dominion:	territory under the control of one ruler or government	
inquisitive:	curious; asking many questions	
beckon:	to signal by motion of the head or hand	
festoon:	string or chain of flowers, leaves, ribbons, etc. hanging in a curve between two points	
prophecy:	something told about what will happen in the future	
fraternize:	to be friendly; to act in a brotherly way	
earnest:	sincere; serious	
reign:	1) to rule 2) period of power of a ruler	
stammer:	to repeat the same sound while trying to speak; to hesitate in speaking	

solemn:	serious	
repulsive:	causing strong dislike <i>“Ugh! That’s gross!”</i>	
centaur:	creature with the head, arms, and chest of a man, and the body and legs of a horse	
venture:	to dare to come or go; to take a risk	
gloat:	to think about or look at something with great satisfaction
